Instructors work independently to create the content of their course/workshop/camp offering and partner with Silvermine Art Center to provide students with valuable arts education at our renowned and established institution. Youth instructors are responsible for teaching students and directing participation in all aspects of specified mediums, which may include (but are not limited to): ceramics, painting, drawing, mixed media, sculpture,

and photography. Implementing a friendly and engaging classroom environment is a central responsibility of the instructor's role.

Summer Art Studios will be planned in early November of 2024. Instructors may offer programming for one or more weeks.
