PAINTING & DRAWING

Basic Techniques of Watercolors

Alex McFarlane Monday | 9:30 AM - 12:30 PM 12 Weeks: September 16 - December 2

LEVEL: BEGINNER - INTERMEDIATE

This course is for beginners and experienced students who want to progress. Watercolor painting is about technical skills that can be learned. There will be a demonstration at the beginning of each class. How to relax and be comfortable while using watercolors is encouraged. In addition, inventive compositions for still life, figure and landscape will be encouraged.

Copying from the Masters

Justin Wiest Monday | 9:30 AM - 12:30 PM 12 Weeks: September 16 - December 2

LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE - ADVANCED

Copying old master works was a time-tested tradition throughout the ages. Students will work from high quality reproductions and be led through a step-bystep approach to thinking and working in the old master manner. Beginning with the drawing, then capturing and slowly building the layers of paint with glazes mixed with chalk and oil, students will learn the full process, which they can the introduce into their own methods of painting. Reproductions will be provided for the students.

Introduction to the Art of Drawing

LEVEL: BEGINNER - INTERMEDIATE

We begin by learning how to measure using our eye, how to create the proportions of our subject. When applying these methods of measurement and proportion, we give drama and expression to our drawings. Learn about shading, perspective and composition. Subjects include basic forms, the figure, portrait and landscapes. Every class will start with a demonstration and individual attention is given to each student. **\$650.00**

Foundational Painting I

Rick McCollum Monday | 1:00 PM - 4:00 PM 12 Weeks: September 16 - December 2

LEVEL: BEGINNER

This class will concentrate on the fundamentals and processes of representational painting. Emphasis will be painting from the still life and photos. Students will learn how to analyze, interpret and apply light to form and space. Class objectives are learning how to use the tools of painting: brushes, how to mix paint, learning value, (the lightness and darkness of an object), using edge control, (soft or hard edges when painting), the properties of color, painting multiple objects with a focal point or points, pictorial composition, painting highly reflective objects like glass and



metal, painting a portrait, lighting and photographing the human head, and learning to mix flesh tones. There will be instructor demos and handouts along with individual student guidance. No prior painting experience is necessary, but some drawing ability is needed.

Abstract Painting with Eric Jiaju Lee

Eric Jiaju Lee Monday | 6:00 PM - 9:00 PM 8 Weeks: September 16 - November 4

LEVEL: BEGINNER

The purpose of this course is to learn how to engage abstraction through painting. Designed for all skill levels, students will learn various approaches to abstract painting. Students will be guided in some of these approaches through the context of art historical examples. Students will also be encouraged to discover their own personal approach to abstract painting. The ideas and techniques that students will learn are: semi to absolute abstraction, geometric abstraction, organic abstraction, process-based abstraction, and atmospheric abstraction. To achieve certain results, students will be learning new and unique approaches that depart, sometimes wildly, from traditional painting methods. Ultimately, this course is meant to demystify what abstract art is, and to allow students to experience the powerful expressiveness of abstract painting. **\$440.00**

Painting Animals in Oils

LEVEL: ALL LEVELS

This class will focus on everything from structure, form, and textures of different types of animals. We will be using a more direct approach to painting, with a simple under-drawing to start. The first half of the semester will have a demonstration by the instructor where each student can follow along step by step. The second half of the semester students will work independently on their favorite animal of choice. Every class will have individual guidance and critique from the instructor. Students have the option to work in traditional or water mixable oils.






