Basic Techniques of Watercolors

Foundational Painting I

LEVEL: BEGINNER

This class will concentrate on the fundamentals and processes of representational painting. Emphasis will be painting from the still life and photos. Students will learn how to analyze, interpret and apply light to form and space. Class objectives are learning how to use the tools of painting: brushes, how to mix paint, learning value, (the lightness and darkness of an object), using edge control, (soft or hard edges when painting), the properties of color, painting multiple objects with a focal point or points, pictorial composition, painting

highly reflective objects like glass and metal, painting a portrait, lighting and photographing the human head, and learning to mix flesh tones. No prior painting experience is necessary, but some drawing ability is needed. **\$450.00**


NEW Color Theory

ALL LEVELS

The purpose of this course is to demystify and clearly explain how color can be applied for spectacular results. Students will learn about color and its many symbolic and expressive aspects. They will approach color as a phenomenon of light and learn about the three dimensions of color: Hue, Value and Saturation, Students will apply their learning about the aspects of color using acrylic paint, through exercises and painting. This also involves understanding the different ways colored paint is made and how their differing qualities influence mixture and application. Students will gain a level of mastery of color to communicate and convey effectively in all their artistic endeavors.
